## GLOBAL EDUCATION ENGAGEMENT IN HAVANA, CUBA DECEMBER 12-18, 2015

### ABOUT THE TRIP

This trip complements EBU 222 Global Education which examines the historical, cultural, economic, sociological, philosophical and political understandings of schooling and education from a global perspective.

In support of Spelman College's Quality Enhancement Plan (QEP), EBU 222 provides scholarly readings, relevant assignments, and a critical context that challenges students' thinking about several factors that impact education and schooling in a variety of countries and regions. This year's trip will give students the opportunity to visit schools in Havana, Cuba and learn about Havana's education system as it intersects with political and cultural structures.

### ABOUT HAVANA

Havana, the capital of Cuba, is the largest city in the Caribbean and one of the most culturally rich urban centers in the world. The city's appreciation of its glorious past is on display with an array of castles, cathedrals, mansions and museums.

### COST

The cost of the trip for at least 20 travelers is approximately \$1,950. Please note that the cost could be more than \$1,950 if less than 20 students enroll, but participants will be informed if this occurs. The cost includes: hotel accommodations; 2 meals a day (excluding arrival and departure days); transportation in Havana; English speaking tour guide; program fees; site visits; and reading material. *The cost does not include airfare, which is projected to be around \$600, travel and medical insurance, gratuities, and airport taxes.* Students must pay a non-refundable deposit of \$500.00 toward the program by September 1, 2015.
